Promiseland was selected because they generate no income and are totally reliant on donations and sponsorships.

This institution gives pre school education to 65 less privileged children on a daily basis. They provide breakfast to these children, and they also

serve lunch to 150 street children. In addition to this they also give sandwiches to more than 1,000 children during their school break.

According to Armand they provided hanging space for the childrens' bags, and they installed toilet roll holders in the bathrooms. In addition they repaired the broken windows.
